Analysis of Ningbo's Imports from Central and Eastern European Countries

From January to February 2023, Ningbo's trade with Central and Eastern European countries totalled 7.87 billion yuan, with a year-on-year increase of 11.6%, of which imports amounted to 2.69 billion yuan with a year-on-year increase of 84.9%. The growth rate was higher than the national and provincial 78.4 and 13.3 percentage points respectively (6.5% nationwide and 71.6% province wide), accounting for 8.07% and 74.2% of the national and provincial shares respectively, up 2.68 and 3.9 percentage points from the end of last year. Imports mainly showed the following characteristics:

(1) From a market perspective, imports from Slovakia and Poland together accounted for more than 80%. from January to February, the proportion of imports from Slovakia and Poland was 69.5% and 12.7% respectively, with a combined share of 82.2%. Among them, imports from Slovakia increased by 175.5% year-on-year, with the main commodity being automobiles; imports from Poland increased by 0.6% year-on-year, with the main commodity being copper. In addition, imports from Greece, Croatia, Serbia, Slovenia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, North Macedonia, Montenegro and other seven countries accounted for less than 1%.

(2) From the commodity structure, automobile as the absolute main force driving the growth of imports. from January to February, the automobile imports 1.86 billion yuan, an increase of 180.2% year-on-year, accounting for nearly 70%, pushing the import growth of 82.5 percentage points. Imports of agricultural products were basically unchanged from last year. 24.89 million yuan of agricultural products were imported from January to February, down 1.0% year-on-year, of which 7.78 million yuan of unlisted foodstuffs were imported, up 166.4% year-on-year, ranked first in scale. 7.65 million yuan of alcoholic beverages were imported, up 27.1% year-on-year, while dairy products fell to the third place in scale, importing 3.57 million yuan, down 72.6% year-on-year. Commodities maintained steady growth. from January to February, the combined imports of unwrought copper and copper, recycled copper raw materials, metal ores and mineral sands, steel and wood and its products amounted to \$670 million, up 10.4% year-on-year, driving import growth by 4.4 percentage points. Consumer goods imports have declined .From January to February, the total import of consumer goods (except automobiles) was 42.76 million yuan, down 26.1% year-on-year, mainly due to a 72.6% and 71.4% year-on-year decrease in the import of dairy products and cosmetics respectively, Reduce the import growth of consumer goods (except automobiles) by 16.4 and 5.1 percentage points.

(3) From the perspective of business entities, the import enterprise entities continue to grow from January to February, imports of the top 30 enterprises, there are 19 new on the list of enterprises, imports of more than 10 million enterprises reached 16, a total of 2.47 billion yuan in imports, a total of 92% of the city's imports, driving the city's import growth of 110.8 percentage points.

(4) From a regional perspective, Beilun District imports accounted for nearly 90% of the city's proportion. from January to February, Beilun District continued to be the largest import region, accounting for 88.5% of the city's proportion, imports rose 157.0% year-on-year, Jiangbei, Haishu, Yinzhou, Yuyao ranked 2-5th.
